This portrait of a young man wearing a turban was probably painted at the very end of the 18th century. The Irish Thomas Hickey was a travelling painter who worked in India during the 1780s and from 1798 to his death in 1824. In comparing our portrait with that of *Purniya*, *Prime Minister of Mysore* painted by the artist around 1801, we find similarities especially in the treatment of the eyes.

The British painter Tilly Kettle (1735-1786) had been the first English portrait painter to travel to India. Kettle and other European artists introduced easel painting and oil painting to India, a country at the time under the dominion of the British East India Company.
